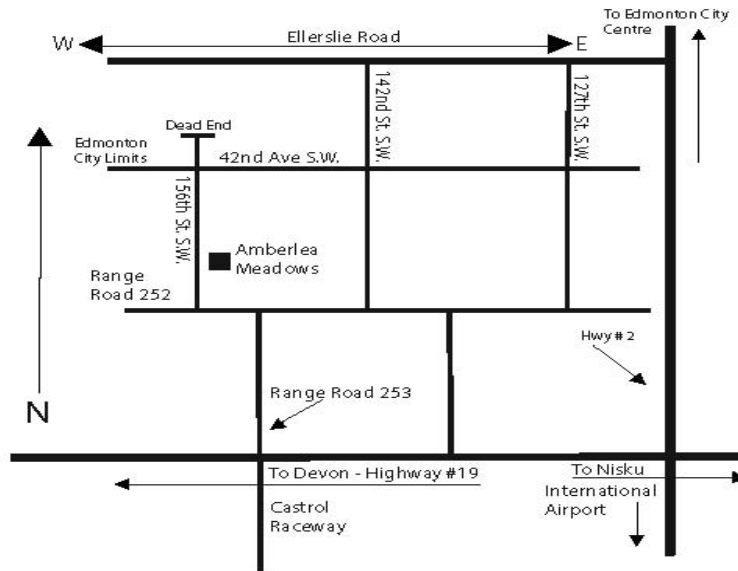

B. The EC Statement Of Principle

Equine Canada or EC, the national equestrian federation of Canada, supports adherence to humane treatment of horses in all competitions under its jurisdiction.

The EC is committed to:

- upholding the welfare of horses, regardless of value, as a primary consideration in all activities.
 - requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect, and the compassion that they deserve, and that they never be subjected to mistreatment.
 - ensuring that owners, trainers, exhibitors and their agents use responsible care in the handling, treatment and transportation of their horses, as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose.
 - providing for the continuous well- being of horses by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort, sanitation and safety as a matter of standard operating procedure.
 - continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare.
 - increasing education in training and horsemanship practices.
 - requiring owners, trainers, and exhibitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competitions.
 - reviewing, revising and developing competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of horses.
- The standard by which conduct or treatment will be measured is that which a reasonable person, informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and exhibition procedures, would determine to be neither cruel, abusive or inhumane.

C. GENERAL RULES AND INFORMATION

1. It is compulsory for the horses competition number to be worn by the horse/ rider/ handler in exercise and schooling areas from the time the number is issued to the end of the competition to identify the horse. Failure to comply will result in a warning for the first offense and possible elimination for subsequent offenses.
2. The show ring will be open for practice prior to the show. Times will be posted at the show office if entries warrant.
3. Any riding time changes must be approved by the show secretary prior to the competition.
4. No person other than the officials, attendants, on duty and the judges of the class may enter the show ring without permission from the officials. Competitors entering the arena outside of the posted warm up times will be eliminated.
5. Inhumane treatment of a horse including polling, rapping or other abuse will not be tolerated and any exhibitor will be disqualified for such an offence.
6. Once a horse has been checked in at the show office, under no circumstances may that horse leave the grounds until after the close of the show or handing in of competition numbers following the completion of the class. Failure to comply with this will result in disqualification. No exceptions will be made to this rule.
7. The Show Committee reserves the right to remove any horse/ rider from the competition without being liable for compensation.
8. Protests shall be made in writing within 48 hours of the holding of the class to the horse show office and must be accompanied by a deposit of \$100 in cash which will be forfeited if the protest is not sustained. All protests must be in writing, signed and addressed to the secretary of the competition at which the matter under consideration occurs.
9. There will be no test readers provided by the show, all riders must supply their own readers.

10. EC Drug Rules will be enforced. Tests may be called for at the discretion of the Drug Testing Committee. "Any horse entered in any class at a competition may, while on the competition grounds be selected for equine medication control testing." A602.5

11. Standard whip length is 120cm. (including lash) and ponies riding in ANY class can only carry a whip of 100cm. Including lash.

D. JUNIORS AND F.E.I. YOUNG RIDER

1. (A) Juniors must wear ATSM/SEI or BSI protective headgear at all times when mounted. The harness must be securely attached. This rule applies even if the junior turns 18 during the competition season in which they continue to compete in junior classes. Failure to comply with these dress regulations will result in elimination. At the tack check a junior may be asked to dismount to allow an inspection of headgear.

(B) All riders wearing protective headgear must have the harness securely attached and the helmet must fit correctly. (E4.1.11)

2. Individuals are considered Juniors until the end of the calendar year in which they turn 18 years of age. Only points earned in junior classes will count toward the Junior Division Award.

Age Clarification

3. A person may compete as an **FEI Young Rider** from the beginning of the calendar year in which he/she reaches the age of 16 until the end of the calendar year in which he/she reaches the age of 21.

4. A person may compete as an **FEI Junior** from the beginning of the calendar year in which he/she reaches the age of 14 until the end of the calendar year in which he/she reaches the age of 18.

5. A person may compete as a **FEI Pony** competitor from the beginning of the calendar year in which he/she reaches the age of 12 until the end of the calendar year in which he/she reaches the age of 16.

6. **FEI Children:** A child may compete as a child from the beginning of the calendar year in which he/she reached the age of 12 until the end of the calendar year in which he/she reaches the age of 14.

E. CLASSES

1. Each horse/ pony is limited to a maximum of **4 technical tests per day**.
2. Tests from Walk/Trot to First Level Test One will be ridden in a 20 x 40 ring. First Level Test 2 to FEI as well as Prix Caprilli will be ridden in the 20 x 60 ring for the duration of the show.
3. Classes may be rescheduled at any time on the day listed in this class schedule. Ride times will only be changed in the case of error, overlapping times, or to facilitate the running of the show. Riders of multiple horses should enter as early as possible to avoid schedule conflicts. Final times posted at the show. Times are only an approximation.
4. Miscellaneous classes are not rated for EC awards. i.e. Walk/trot- Classes 100,101,200,201

Day sheets will be posted and competitors need to pay attention to the show office, announcements and class time postings.

F. STABLE RULES

1. Stabling is mandatory at Amberlea Meadows for all competitors at a rate of \$45.00 a night or \$35.00 for a day stall. Tack stalls are available.
2. Feed and bedding is available for sale from the show office.
3. No horse will be placed in an unassigned stall without approval from management discretion of the Show Manager. Special requests should be noted on the entry form, and will be accommodated at the discretion of show management.
4. The stable area must be kept clean at all times and aisles unobstructed.

G. ENTRY INFORMATION

1. Entries must be received by March 5/2010 or April 5/2010. All cheques and money orders are to be made payable to Amberlea Meadows and must be mailed to:

An entry is not considered valid until it has been paid in full. Absolutely no telephone entries. Entries may be faxed provided that these entries are paid by credit card and that a copy of the EC membership card is also attached.

2. Late entries, being those entries made before the show starts but after entries close, may be accepted with the approval of the Show Secretary. Late entries must be accompanied by a \$25 late entry fee. Any Competitors making any changes to the classes entered after the entry closing day will be subject to a \$30.00 change fee per change.

3. You must attach a copy of the current year competitors and owners EC membership card to your show entry form. Entries are not complete without the copy.

4. A schedule of riding times will be available to all competitors on Tuesday, March 9 or April 13. For your scheduled times, ride times will be posted on our website at www.amberleameadows.com on Tuesday March 9 or April 13th. FINAL RIDE TIMES POSTED DAILY AT SHOW OFFICE.

5. Each NSF cheque will be charged \$30.00.

6. Only one horse per entry form. The entry form may be photocopied.

7. Entries may be made in the name of a stable or farm, provided that such stable or farm name is registered with the EC and the owner(s) are all individual competitor members in good standing with the EC. All owners, if different from riders must also be members of the EC.

9. The show organizers reserve the right to refuse any entry.

10. If time allows, horses may be entered Hors Concours (non-competitive). having once competed Hors Concours at a competition, a horse is no longer eligible for further prizes, awards or placings at that competition. Such entries must pay the full entry fee, but are not eligible for any places, ribbons, trophies or prize money and are subject to all EC Rules.

11. HORSES MAY BE RIDDEN BY MORE THAN ONE RIDER AT A COMPETITION BUT NOT MORE THAN ONCE IN A DIVISION. Example: A Horse may enter Training Level with a Junior in the Junior and or Open Category. The same horse with a senior rider may enter First Level Adult Amateur and or Open Category. A SEPARATE ENTRY FORM MUST BE USED FOR EACH HORSE/RIDER COMBINATION.

12. There will be no refund of entry fees after the official entry closing date except with a veterinarian's or doctor's certificate. 25% of the entry fees and the \$30.00 administration charge will be withheld. There will be no refund on stabling. No refund on entries will be granted after the first class starts on the first day of the show.

13. Exhibitors and horse owners must hold individual competitive EC licenses.

14. The EC, Amberlea Meadows, Show Officials and Show volunteers shall not be responsible for any damages, losses, accidents, or any actions whatsoever that may occur to any entrant, owner, exhibitor, or spectator during the show. Parties execute a binding agreement upon signing of entry form.

Points will be awarded to all riders competing in both Amberlea Meadows Dressage Schooling shows. The top junior, senior and walk trot riders of both schooling shows will be awarded an Amberlea Meadows medal and a High Point Award. The total of the highest three percentages for each level will be used as scores to determine the Champion. Riders must receive qualifying scores (ie. above 50%) in at least 3 tests in each level to be eligible for championship awards

Junior and Senior High Score Award

A Junior High Score & Senior High Score prize will be awarded at each show, the scores from an average of 2 tests to be compiled. A Walk Trot High Score prize (junior and senior) will also be awarded. In order to qualify for a high point award, a rider must ride at least two tests within the same level. If a rider is in more than two classes, the highest two scores will be used towards the high point. The rider may not ride the same test twice to qualify for a high point award but may do so for schooling purposes.
