**STATEMENT OF PRINCIPLE**

Equestrian Canada (EC), the national equestrian federation of Canada, supports adherence to humane treatment of horses in all activities under its jurisdiction.

- . EC is committed to:
- . Upholding the welfare of the horses, regardless of value, as a primary consideration in all activities;
- . Requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect and the compassion that they deserve, and that they never be subjected to mistreatment;
- . Ensuring that owners, trainers and exhibitors or their agents use responsible care in the handling, treatment and transportation of their horses as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose;
- . Providing for the continuous well-being of horses by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort and safety as a matter of standard operating procedure;
- . Continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare;
- . Increasing education in training and horsemanship practices;
- . Requiring owners, trainers and exhibitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules, and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competition;
- . Reviewing, revising and developing competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of the horses.

The standard by which conduct or treatment will be measured is that which a person, informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and exhibition procedures, would determine to be neither cruel, abusive, nor inhumane.

Per Article A801 every entry at an EC-sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person responsible that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider and horse shall be subject to the EC constitution and all rules of EC and any additional rules set by the competition. It is the responsibility of all individuals participating in any capacity in EC- sanctioned competitions to be knowledgeable regarding the EC constitution and the applicable rules of EC and the additional rules, if any, imposed by the competition. Do not participate in this EC- sanctioned competition in any capacity if you do not consent to be bound by the constitution and rules of EC and any additional rules imposed by the competition.

## **ENTRY INFORMATION AND RULES**

### **1. Entries must be received by June 27, 2022 with full payment for the July 9-10, 2022 Dressage Festival**

Entries must be in the hands of the show secretary by the closing date listed. Entry is not considered valid until it has been paid in full. Entries can be email/courier Hard copy entry forms also available online at [www.amberleameadows.com](http://www.amberleameadows.com). Or Equestrian Entries online at [www.equestrianentries.com](http://www.equestrianentries.com).

Late entries may only be accepted at the show secretary's discretion with a late fee of \$75, no late entries after July 1 will be accepted. Please email the show secretary to determine if late entries will be accepted

All cheques and money orders are to be made payable to Amberlea Meadows. Postdated cheques will not be accepted. Full payments by cheque / Visa/Master card or e-transfer are accepted. NSF cheque will be charged \$40.00.

2. Horses competing in an EC Gold show are required to hold an EC Horse Recording and have paid the EC Horse Recording Annual Activation Fee to compete, a temporary Horse Registration form may be purchased. Horse Recording number is the control number used by EC and must be included on the entry. Horses must be entered under the name appearing on the Horse recording. Owners and competitors holding a Horse Recording who wish to apply for an FEI passport refer to Article A412. (Note: Horses that formerly held EC Passports will carry the same number forward to their Horse Recording.) Temporary sport licenses and temp. horse registration available at the show office

3. Gold Classes Riders, owners and lessees are required to hold a sport license equivalent to the level at which the rider and horse are competing. The owner must hold a license equivalent to the level at which his/her horse is competing, regardless of whether he/she is riding the horse in competition. A one time upgrade License Upgrade – Single Event maybe purchased Bronze-Gold is \$43 or Silver to Gold is \$21)

4. Entries in the Wild Rose Show only do not require EC Sport Licenses for the rider nor EC Horse Recordings. The rider does require AEF (or other Provincial) membership. Tests ridden in the Wild Rose classes are not eligible for Equestrian Canada awards.

### **5. EQUINE VACCINATION RULE**

**“All horses attending Equestrian Canada sanctioned competitions must have met the requirements of Article A519, Vaccinations. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article A519.**

All horses coming on to the grounds must provide proof of valid Equine Influenza and EHV vaccinations (vaccinations must be administered within the last 6 months, but not within 7 days of arrival to the grounds). Horses not in compliance with this rule may be asked to leave event site at the discretion of competition management.

6. Entries in the Gold show must pay a mandatory DC Levy Fee of \$10.00 and an Equestrian Canada drug fee of \$7.00. “Any horse entered in any class at a competition may be selected for equine medication control while at the event location..” (A602.5) Medication Control Fee: \$7.00.

7. All entries must have the signature of the owner or agent and a signature for the person responsible for the horse. Riders will not be allowed to ride without a person responsible signature. The owner, person responsible and rider of the horse competing must be EC Individual competitor members in good standing. See A1011 for clarification of person responsible. The Person Responsible (PR) for a horse must be an adult who has, or shares responsibility for the care, training, custody, and performance of the horse and who has official responsibility for that horse under EC Rules. The PR is liable under the penalty provisions of the applicable EC Rules for any rule violations. Every entry form for an EC sanctioned competition must identify the PR and be signed by the PR. The Person Responsible is ultimately responsible for the condition, fitness and management of the horse and is alone responsible for any act performed by himself/herself or by any other person with authorized access to the horse in the stables, elsewhere on the grounds, or while the horse is being ridden, driven or exercised.

8 It is compulsory for the horse's competition number to be worn by the horse/ rider/ handler in exercise and schooling areas from the time the number is issued to the end of the competition to identify the horse. Failure to comply will result in a warning for the first offense and possible elimination for subsequent offenses.

9. “When registering for EC sanctioned competitions, athletes must indicate the name of their coach on the entry form or specify that they are self-coached. Coaches from other countries, must be in good standing with their home federation and must declare/have proof of insurance” See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article 102, Safe Sport Environments.

10. Schooling horses not competing at cost of \$42.00 per day (schooling horse fee). Rider/Owner must complete entry form and will be assigned a Horse Number which must always be worn when on grounds. Riders will be required to pay the full stabling fee, schooling horse fee, and the office fee and will be subject to all Equine Competition rules. The rider will be required to have an AEF membership, but will not be required to have an EC membership and the horse will not require EC Horse Recording.

11. Any riding time changes must be approved by the show secretary prior to the competition.

12. No person other than the officials, stewards, attendants, on duty and the judges of the class may enter the show ring without permission from the officials. Competitors entering the arena outside of the posted warm up times will be eliminated.

13. Lungeing will only be permitted in a designated lungeing area. Please ask once you arrive at the show grounds for more information. E7.16.5. The use of side reins is only permitted when lunging. Lungeing (un-mounted) and work in hand may only be done by the rider, owner, coach, groom or Person Responsible. Please do not ride in designated area when a horse is being lunged.

14. Inhumane treatment of a horse including polling, rapping or other abuse will not be tolerated, and any exhibitor will be disqualified for such an offence.

15. The Show Committee reserves the right to remove any horse/ rider from the competition without being liable for compensation.

16. Protests shall be made in writing within 48 hours of the holding of the class to the horse show office and must be accompanied by a deposit of \$100 in cash which will be forfeited if the protest is not sustained. All protests must be in writing, signed and addressed to the secretary of the competition at which the matter under consideration occurs.

17. There will be no test readers provided by the show, all riders must supply their own readers.

18. Standard whip length is 120 cm including the lash and ponies ridden in ANY class can only carry a whip of 100 cm Including Lash E4.8.3 & .4

19. Mane may be braided.

- . White or black braiding tape is permitted.
- . White, black or coloured thread/wool/elastic bands are permitted
- . Braiding wire is permitted
- . Braiding bands are permitted, including decorated bands that have a smooth base and do not have any sharp edges.

Any decoration of the horse with extravagant items, such as ribbons or flowers, etc. in the mane and tail, etc., is strictly forbidden (E4.1.10)

20. There will be a Veterinarian and a Farrier on call; their names and numbers will be posted in the Show Office.

21. Safety Headgear: All riders, regardless of age or level of competition, must always wear ASTM/SEI or BSI/BS EN approved protective headgear when mounted at any EC sanctioned dressage competitions at the event location.

Note: At the tack check, which that follows the test, the steward may ask the athlete to dismount so that the helmet can be inspected for the safety standard labelling. (E 4.0)

**22. Riding times: will be posted on the Fox Village Dressage website at <http://www.foxvillage.com/fvdshowresults> as soon as available to all competitors on Tuesday July 5. Every effort will be made to accommodate riders to allow for suitable warm up when possible. FINAL RIDE TIMES POSTED DAILY AT SHOW OFFICE. Riders are responsible for checking the day sheets as ride times may change. Please provide a correct email on your entry form.**

23. The show organizers reserve the right to refuse any entry. (Other than as specified in Article A805.2, a competition may reserve the right to refuse an entry). Entries will be entered on a first come first serve basis. Entry early to assure your place. Classes maybe changed up to closing date without penalty. Any changes made to entries after closing date will be charged a \$15 penalty.

24. Hors Concours entries will be accepted with full fees. Entrants are subject to EC rules, and are not eligible for awards.

25. Cancellations prior to the closing date will have all fees less the Administration Fee refunded. Cancellations after the closing date with a veterinary certificate or medical certificate will have stabling fees, drug fees, EC Levy and 50% of the class fees refunded. Cancellations after the closing date without a veterinary certificate or medical certificate will have stabling fees, drug fees and EC levy refunded. Administration and class fees will not be refunded. Cancellations after this date will forfeit all fees. Substitutions will be permitted, prior to the start of the show, for a fee of \$25.00

26. Horse substitutions are allowed until one hour before class the horse is competing in. The name of the horse, any required licenses and owner or personal responsible signatures must be given to the show secretary at the time of substitution is made.

27. Competitors are responsible for checking the day sheets posted at the show office, the evening before, and/or the morning of their tests to ensure they are aware of the correct time. Remember, your time is when you ride down centerline,

28. Please note that Coggins Tests will not be required for this show. As per Article A519 **All horses are required to be verifiably current on Influenza and EHV 1-4 vaccines (within 6 months)** You must provide proof of vaccination for all of your horses on the grounds, showing or non competing. Please avoid any direct or indirect contact between horses, in particular nose to nose contact and use of any common feed/ drinking buckets

29. The Masters Test of Choice Class – The Masters Test of Choice Class is an EC dressage class that provides senior riders, 60 years and older, the opportunity to participate in a dressage class that is exclusively their own that provides a fair playing field for senior riders wherein each will compete against their peers at all levels of skill, from beginners to advanced. The class will feature one test per day – please identify which test on your entry. Please review EC rules for the list of accommodations available. Masters riders may also compete in non-Masters dressage classes.

31. Please provide a correct email on your entry form. (Competitors are responsible for their own errors or those of their agents in preparation of their entry forms)

32. The EC, Amberlea Meadows, Show Officials and Show volunteers shall not be responsible for any damages, losses, accidents, or any actions whatsoever that may occur to any entrant, owner, exhibitor, or spectator during the show. Parties execute a binding agreement upon signing of entry form.

33. **The warm-up rings are open during** all the show and schooling time.

#### **STABLE RULES**

The stabling is not available until noon, Friday, July 8, 2022. Please do not plan your arrival before this time. Warm up in all rings will be available from 12:00 p.m. – 8:00 p.m. Friday and for one hour after the completion of the last class on Saturday. This time will be posted and confirmed when scheduling is completed. Riding in the competition arena outside of these times will result in the elimination of the horse and rider from competition.

1. **Show stalls** are available from **12:00 noon, Friday, July 08, 2022** until the end of the Show on **Sunday July 10, 2022**. at a cost of \$115.50. **\*\*\*First bedding of 2 bags of shavings is provided please indicate on your entry form.\*\*\*** Tack Stalls \$105.00 Hauling in for the day is allowed, and a day stall may be purchased for \$63.00/day (includes 2 shavings). Haul-ins are also allowed for a Haul in fee of \$36.75 per day. Tack stalls are available. Feed and bedding is available for sale from the show office

2. All dogs must be kept on a leash. Please clean up after your dog.
3. NO SMOKING IN THE BARN OR HAYSHED!!
4. Horses must be put in assigned stalls only! No bedding may be removed out of unoccupied stalls. No horse will be placed in an unassigned stall without approval from management. Stalls will be assigned at the sole discretion of the Show Manager. Special requests should be noted on the entry form and will be accommodated at the discretion of show management.
5. The stable area must always be kept clean and aisles unobstructed
6. **Shavings – PRE-ORDER WITH YOUR STALL** – will be arranged by the horse show from quality suppliers on a pre-order basis so **place your orders for shavings with stall orders**. Your order will be delivered to your stall(s). 2 Shavings are included additional shavings must be purchased in advance for \$9.45/bag.
7. Please deposit all manure and hay in manure bins.
8. **Absolutely NO use of Nails in Tack Stalls.**

**Note: If you would like to be stabled next to someone, please ensure that the same Stable Group Name or trainer is used, as this is how the stalls are assigned.**

**SCHOOLING TIME** - The show rings will be open for practice prior to the show. Times will be posted at the show office if entries warrant. All show rings will be open for warm-up up until Friday evening from 1pm-8 pm. No warm-up in the show rings is allowed from Saturday a.m. until the conclusion of the show.

#### **RV PARKING**

1. Campers or motorhomes are to be parked in the southwest parking lot by the arena, where plug-ins are available for \$42/ night or \$84 weekend. No RV's with propane tanks will be allowed to park within 50 feet of any building to avoid potential fire risk. Showers are available for public use in the main barn area. A septic tank dumping station is also available for use.

#### **COVID WAIVER**

I acknowledge the contagious nature of COVID-19 and voluntarily assume the risk that my child(ren) and I may be exposed to or infected by COVID-19 by attending Amberlea Stables Ltd. and The Amberlea Dressage Festival Show Horse Show and that such exposure or infection may result in personal injury, illness, permanent disability, and death. I understand the risk of becoming exposed to or infected by COVID-19 at Amberlea Stables Ltd. or Amberlea Dressage Festival Horse Show may result from the actions, omissions, or negligence of myself and others, including, but not limited to Amberlea Stables employees, volunteers, and participants and their families.

#### **COVID PROTOCOLS**

The Amberlea Dressage Festival Horse Show is adhering to COVID-19 protocols set by Alberta Health Services, the Alberta Provincial Government and the Federal Government of Canada. We will do our best to update competitors as quickly as possible if there are changes. Please note that protocols may change with very little notice.

#### **BIOSECURITY**

Bio Security is everyone's responsibility! Amberlea Meadows is committed to providing a safe and healthy environment for all exhibitors and their horses. All show participants are requested to practice good disease prevention practices. Travelling and showing horses are at an increased risk for spreading and contracting contagious diseases. All horses entering the show grounds must not have been in contact with any sick horses within the last 14 days. They must not exhibit any sign of illness. All horses coming on to the grounds must provide proof of valid Equine Influenza and EHV vaccinations (vaccinations must be administered within the last 6 months, but not within 7 days of arrival to the grounds). Horses exhibiting any signs of illness are not permitted on the grounds. All horses on the grounds must have their temperatures taken and recorded twice daily. Please have temperature records available upon request. Competitors are required to notify the tournament office at the first

sign of illness or elevated temperature. Horses missing valid vaccinations will NOT be permitted on the grounds and entries are NOT eligible for a refund of fees. NO EXCEPTIONS. Please take the horses temperature 3 days prior to bringing them to the show grounds (this includes horses hauling in). Horses are not permitted to come on to the grounds if they are stabled at a facility where any horses have been at a venue with a confirmed case of EHV (neurologic or non-neurologic) or any other transmissible disease/ illness within the last 10 days. In the case of a horse that is unable to receive either of the vaccinations due to a history of adverse reactions, the exhibitor must provide a letter from the veterinarian on official letterhead stating that the horse in question cannot be vaccinated due to medical concerns and a log of temperatures taken twice daily for the seven days prior to entering the competition grounds then continue to follow temperature checks twice daily while on the grounds. Please avoid direct and/or indirect contact between horses, especially nose-to-nose contact

- Please read the full Biosecurity and Vaccination details in the prize list and adhere to all recommendations.
- Please ensure you include the following:  
With your entry: Proof of vaccination
- Prior to the show: Take your horses temperature 3 consecutive days prior to bringing them to the show grounds.  
At the show: All horses on the grounds must have their temperatures taken and recorded twice daily. Temperatures should be taken while your horse is in a relaxed state (so not immediately after exercise) and should be below 102F

### **CLASSES**

1. A horse/rider combination may compete in any two, but only two consecutive levels and a maximum of four tests per day including the freestyle for Introductory, Training and First levels, and three tests per day including the freestyle for Second; Third and Fourth levels and all FEI tests. All Tests will be ridden in a 20 x 60 ring for the duration of the show. (A 7.1.1.9.1)
2. Ride times will only be changed in the case of error, overlapping times, or to facilitate the running of the show. Riders of multiple horses should enter as early as possible to avoid schedule conflicts. Final times to be emailed, posted on the shows website and on Foxvillage. Times are only an approximation.
3. Test of Choice Classes may only be entered once per class. Tests ridden in TOC classes may be used as qualifiers for Gold Provincial/Regional/National championships as well as for Silver Championships and team qualifications, if permitted in the team qualification criteria. Tests Ridden in TOC Classes may be used to qualify for Gold, Silver or Bronze Show Championships. (E7.31)
4. Exhibitors must be ready to compete when scheduled.
5. Class results will be posted online at Foxvillage dressage and posted on the show grounds throughout the show.
6. Any horse receiving less than 50% of the total points obtainable shall not be eligible for awards
7. When there is only one horse in a class placing will be determined as per the following chart of percentages:
  - 1st – 60% of higher
  - 2nd – 57% to 59.9%
  - 3rd – 54% to 56.9%
  - 4th – 51% to 53.9%
8. In the event of a tie, ties will be broken by the collective marks. Ties remaining after collective marks will stay tied.
9. Prize will be awarded to Freestyle
10. Combining Classes – if there are fewer than three entries in a category, the committee may combine entries into the Open Category.

1. Freestyle Music must be provided to the show organizer, at least 2 hours prior to the start of the class. Your Freestyle music **MUST BE RECORDED ON A USB STICK**, please label with your name and your horses name.

- Competitors are responsible to do a sound check with the announcer
- Freestyle eligibility for athletes in Gold competitions (all EC levels and FEI freestyle levels): A horse/rider combination must have obtained the following prior to competing in a freestyle: a minimum score of 60% in a dressage test at the same technical level, or higher, as the freestyle they wish to enter (e.g. 60% in First or Second Level to compete in the First and/or Second Level Freestyle). The dressage score may have been obtained at an EC Gold/Silver dressage competition prior to the competition or may be obtained at the same competition in which they wish to enter the freestyle.



## GOLD CHAMPIONSHIP AND RESERVE CHAMPIONSHIP

Championship and Reserve Championships will be awarded for each Division and Category with 3 or more entries. A final minimum average score of 60% must be obtained to be eligible for Championship. A final minimum average score of 58% must be obtained to be eligible for Reserve Championship. Divisions / categories with less than 3 riders may be combined for Championship and Reserve Championship at the discretion of the Show Committee. Horse / Rider combinations must ride 2 different tests in the level to be eligible (ie Training Test 1 and Training Test 3 or Training Test 1 and Training Test 2).. Championships will be awarded as follows

- Introductory through Second Level riders must compete in a minimum of 3 tests at that level to qualify for Championships.

Introductory Championship: The combined total of top 3 percentage technical scores from the designated Championship Classes (C). Introductory will have a Champion & Reserve Champion in both Junior & Open categories.

Training to Fourth Level: The combined total of top 3 percentage technical scores from the designated Championship Classes (C), one of which must be the most difficult test of the level (Training-Second: Test 3, Third – Fourth: Test 3) FEI Combined Technical Scores Highpoint Award.

- Training, First and Second Levels will have a Champion & Reserve Champion in each of the Junior, Adult Amateur and Open categories
- Third Level will have a Champion and Reserve Champion awarded to the combined categories of Junior, Adult Amateur and Open.
- Fourth Level will have a Champion and Reserve Champion awarded to the combined categories of Junior, Adult Amateur and Open.

FEI Divisions will be divided into Advanced and Youth and each will have a Champion and Reserve Champion

- FEI Advanced-Open -includes Intermediate 1 /2 /A /B, Prix St. Georges, Grand Prix, Grand Prix Special
- FEI Youth includes –FEI Children’s, FEI Pony, FEI Junior and FEI Young Rider
- TOC classes will not be used except for the FEI TOC and FEI Youth TOC classes.

Freestyle Championship Awards:

- USDF(EC) Freestyle Champion (USDF Training Freestyle to USDF Fourth Level Freestyle)
- FEI Freestyle Champion

To compete in the freestyle riders must have achieved a 60% at any Silver or Gold show at their level. (e.g. The freestyle score will be added to the athletes’ best technical score from the same level/division).

- There will be no mounted presentations.
- Freestyle scores will not count towards championships
- In the event of a tie, the competitor with the highest single percentage score is declared the winner.**
- Championships and Reserve Championships will be awarded/handed out at a designated spot once they are confirmed and posted.
- Gold Class Championships will be awarded as follows based only on scores in designated classes (Marked with “c”)

## WILDROSE CHAMPIONSHIP AND RESERVE CHAMPIONSHIP

1. There will be NO mounted presentations for Championship Awards, Championships to be handed out from a centralized location once they are confirmed by the show office. 2. To be eligible for Championship awards, the competitor must ride at least 2 different tests in each level. The two highest percentage marks of two different tests will be averaged, and the competitor with the highest average will be declared the Champion and the competitor with the second highest averaged declared the Reserve. In the event of a tie, the competitor with the highest single percentage score is declared the winner
