Wild Rose Provincial Circuit Competition Riders only:

Do not require EC Sport Licenses for the rider nor EC Horse Recordings. The rider does require AEF (or other Provincial) membership. All competitors that reside in Alberta are required to pay an AEF levy fee of \$7 at Wild Rose Provincial Circuit competitions. Jump Alberta membership is required for show results to be tabulated for provincial circuit year end awards.

Entries for the Edmonton Classic EC Gold (for JC Medal, CET Medal and Mini-Medal)

Owners and lessees are required to hold a sport license equivalent to the level at which the rider and horse are competing. The owner must hold a license equivalent to the level at which his/her horse is competing, regardless of whether he/she is riding the horse in competition. (A one time upgrade License Upgrade – Single Event maybe purchased Single Event Upgrades are available for purchase **directly through the competitors MyEC portal**. There is a flat rate of \$55 per upgrade, regardless of levels being upgraded.

JUMP CANADA LEVY A \$25 levy will be collected for every horse entered in a Jumping Gold Level tournament. This levy will be used to support a number of regional and national programs designed to foster the activities of Hunter/Jumper riders, owners, and the industry at large.

JUMP ALBERTA LEVY Amberlea Meadows continues to support all levels of the sport in the province of Alberta. Competitors who reside in the province of Alberta and are participating at any JA tournaments are required to be a member of our provincial association, in order to compete. All competitors that reside in Alberta are required to pay a levy fee of \$10 at gold competition. This fee helps to fund horse and rider development programs that will directly benefit Alberta athletes. Membership is available online at:

- Jump Alberta Membership is also required.

- All horses attending Equestrian Canada / sanctioned competitions must have met the requirements of Article A519, Vaccinations. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article A519, Vaccinations.

“Per Article A801, every entry at an EC-sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person responsible that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider and horse shall be subject to the EC constitution and all rules of EC and any additional rules set by the competition...” (A602.7)

EC SPORT LICENSING 2026

SAFETY, INCLUSIVITY, & EXCELLENCE

Your guide to the latest updates for the competition season in Canada

IMPORTANT CHANGES have been implemented to enhance the safety and inclusivity of equestrian sport. Whether you're an athlete, parent, coach, official, or competition staff, your role is crucial in upholding these standards. Here's what you need to know:

SAFE SPORT TRAINING PREREQUISITE:

- The two free EC Safe Sport training modules must be completed before purchasing a Sport Licence. Check your training status on MyEC by clicking on the ECampus button.

DISCONTINUED TEMPORARY LICENCES AND TEMPORARY HORSE REGISTRATIONS:

- Temporary EC Sport Licences are now discontinued at competitions. All riders, owners, and coaches must possess an EC Sport Licence to participate in events. All horses must have a Horse Recording where level and division require.

AVAILABLE SHOW LEVEL UPGRADES:

- Explore higher-level competitions with temporary upgrades via your MyEC Portal. Note: National Rankings Points are not tabulated for upgraded results.

COACH STATUS REMINDER—2026 SEASON

- Coaches attending EC-Sanctioned competition must hold a valid Licensed Coach Status. Any Coach with Registered Coach Status must purchase a Single Event Upgrade for \$55.00. This purchase can be made through the My EC account.
- Coaches without a valid Licensed Coach Status or Registered Coach Status with Single Event Upgrade Status are not eligible to be represented as a coach at EC-Sanctioned events and may be subject to fines. Please complete your requirements in advance to avoid any fines and delays.

DECLARE YOURSELF A SELF-COACHED ATHLETE

- Athletes without a coach on-site can declare themselves as self-coached by entering their own **EC SPORT LICENSE NUMBER** or enter "self-coached" in the **COACH FIELD** on their registration/entry form.
- Please note: Coaches that **DO NOT ATTEND** the events **SHOULD NOT BE LISTED** on the entry form.

“ When registering for EC sanctioned competitions, athletes must indicate the name of their coach on the entry form or specify that they are self-coached. Coaches from other countries, must be in good-standing with their home federation and must declare/have proof of insurance. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article 102, Safe Sport Environments. ”

No tack change is permitted between phases. Rides may not have guidance from trainers for second phase. The winner will be determined by the combined score of both phases.

Class 200 CET Medal Class

Entry fee: \$30.00

Open to Gold members of Equestrian Canada and members of the Canadian Equestrian Team (EC/CET) who have not reached their 21st birthday as of January 1st. Both memberships MUST be in place in order to compete. This also applies to all foreign competitors. The class will be judged 60% over fences and 40% on the flat and will be run under jumper rules. Three entries are required to complete the course. The flat phase is to include lengthening of stride and counter canter. The course will consist of at least 10 fences 1.10m to 1.15m in height with spreads to 1.40m. A time allowed will be established based on the speed of 350 meters per minute. Change of tack is permitted between phases. NO martingales in the flat phase. Standing martingales, gags and hackamores are not permitted in the flat phase.. See Article G1111.

Headgear: Conservative colored protective headgear (as per article G1103) with no additional adornments.

Tack and Equipment: G1111 Only running martingales are permitted over fences. No martingales are permitted during the flat phase.

Class 201 CET Mini Medal Class

Entry fee: \$30.00

Open to junior and amateur riders who are members of Equestrian Canada.

CET membership is not required.

The CET MINI MEDAL CLASS is to be held under the same rules and regulations as the CET Medal (see Article G1101 and G1110)) with the exception of the following:

1. There is no age limit for this class.
2. Senior riders must be amateurs as per Article G108 and possess a current EC amateur card. Note that amateur cards must be purchased annually.
3. Phase Requirements:
 - a) Jumping phase - maximum 1.00m
 - b) Gymnastic jumping phase - maximum 0.90m (3')
 - c) Flat Phase - the counter canter is strongly recommended.
4. There will be no water jump in any of the competitions, but a Liverpool is mandatory.
5. Eligibility Requirements:
 - a) Riders competing in 1.20m or higher jumper divisions are not eligible.
 - b) Riders may not cross enter between the Mini Medal and the CET Medal class at the same competition.
 - c) Riders may qualify for both the CET Mini Medal and the CET Medal Final, but may compete in only one Regional Final

Class 202. JC MEDAL 3'6 Entry Fee: \$30

Open to all junior riders that are EC Gold sport license holders. Judged 60% over fences and 40% flat. All contestants or a minimum of eight shall be called back to perform at a walk, trot and canter. From a minimum of four of the contestants, the judge is required to call for a minimum of two or more requirements from Article G1009. Tests. No change of tack between phases. Three entries are required to run the class. If less than 3 complete the class, see G1105.4 for special rules. Riders may not cross enter into a 3'0" medal class at the same competition.



Prairie Region Medal Scholarship Program

SPONSORED BY SHOW JUMPING CANADA

An unlimited number of scholarships will be awarded to competitors in the CET Medal, CET Mini Medal, 1.10m Eclipse Medal, and 1.00m Eclipse Medal based off of scores earned. Riders who earn a combined score of minimum 156 out of a combined total of 200 in the CET Medal/CET Mini Medal and 1.10m Eclipse Medal/1.00m Eclipse Medal will receive a scholarship of \$150.00 at ALL EC Gold Sanctioned tournaments in Alberta, Manitoba, and Saskatchewan.

All bursaries won will be paid out to riders following the completion of Royal West.

EXAMPLE: A competitor earns a score of 76 in the CET Medal, and a score of 80 in the Eclipse Medal for a combined total of 156/200, a scholarship **will be awarded**.

If a competitor earns a score of 75 in the CET Medal and a score of 70 in the Eclipse Medal for a combined total of 145/200, a scholarship **will not be awarded**.

The top 4 CET Medal riders at the Prairie Regional Finals will receive a guaranteed travel bursary of \$1,000. These riders will also receive complimentary entry to the \$15,000 Barbara Anderson Equitation Team Challenge at 2025 Royal West.

\$15,000 Barbara Anderson Team Equitation Challenge

To celebrate the year, RMSJ will again host the Barbara Anderson Team Equitation Challenge at Royal West, with \$15,000 in bursaries being awarded to the top 4 teams. Teams of three (one professional and two junior/amateur riders) will compete over a gymnastic-style course.

Scores in Wild Rose Medal will be used if CET Medal is not being hosted.

GENERAL INFORMATION

JUMPER CLASSES

Jumpers will be scored under Alternate Table A (FEI Article 220). Horses may be required to jump in posted order. Exhibitors riding more than one horse in any class if not listed on the entry form (i.e. catch rider) must inform the Horse Show Office one-hour before the class goes so that their rides may be spaced. At no time will the gate be held for more than five minutes due to rider/trainer conflicts. Jump-off to be ridden over a shortened course. Some fences may be raised by 3". All jumpers should be prepared to jump off immediately if clear.

Jumper Division may include – Time first, Speed, and Power and Speed. All classes run under EC National Rule: FEI Art 230: elimination after two refusals in ALL JUMPER RINGS.

Nominated Rings

Horses entered in the Grass Grand Prix Ring pay a nomination fee of \$125. Horses entered in Low Jumper Ring will pay a nomination fee of \$85. Jumper nomination fees are non-refundable. Nomination fees allow jumpers in each of these rings to move from classes and/or divisions without an add/scratch fee.

Jumper Nominating Fee Refund Policy

Jumper nomination fee refund schedule will be as follows: before the closing date of entries – 100%, after the closing date, but before the start of the show – 50%. After the show starts there will be no refunds. No refund on stabling after closing date of entries May 9, 2026

FEI ARTICLE 229 ACCUMULATOR COMPETITION

1. This competition takes place over 10 obstacles with an increasing difficulty. Combination obstacles are not allowed. The increasing difficulty is not solely due to the height and spread of the obstacles, but also to the difficulty of the track.

2. Bonus points are awarded as follows:

- 1 point for obstacle No 1 not knocked down
- 2 points for obstacle No 2 not knocked down
- 3 points for obstacle No 3 not knocked down

etc. with a total of 55 points. No point is awarded for an obstacle knocked down. Faults other than knock-downs are penalized as for Table A.

3. This competition will take place against the clock without a jump-off. In the event of a tie in total points, a jump-off will occur for first place following the initial round. In case of a jump-off there will be a minimum of six obstacles, which may be increased in height and/or spread. The obstacles in the jump-off must be jumped in the same order as in the first round and retain their respective points allotted in the first round.

4. For the last obstacle of the course, an alternative obstacle will be provided, of which one element will be designated the Joker. The Joker will be more difficult than the alternative obstacle and carry double points. If the Joker is knocked down, these points must be deducted from the total points obtained so far by the athlete.

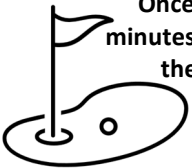

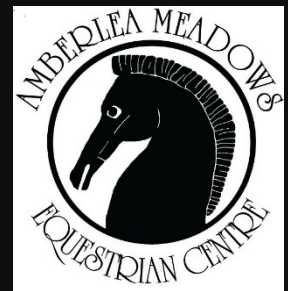

GENERAL RULES AND INFORMATION

1. The management reserves the right to decide any point not covered in the rules and to correct any error or make any alterations that may be necessary in the prize list. EC rules and regulations will be followed.
2. The management reserves the right to cancel or combine any class not filled to satisfaction; whereupon exhibitors will be notified as soon as possible after close of entries. Show Management reserves the right to make changes of arenas, rings, judges or class order to facilitate time schedule and weather/site conditions.
3. Inhumane treatment of a horse will not be tolerated. Violation of this rule, at the discretion of the organization committee, will result in disqualification and forfeiture of fees, all winnings and loss of entry.
4. Numbers must always be worn and visible in the schooling and/or exercise areas as well as in the competition ring. (A 814) Any exhibitor using a wrong number, or having no number, may be excused or disqualified from the class, at the judge's discretion.
5. Exhibitors are warned that any act of discourtesy or disobedience to the officials on the part of the owner, handler or rider, will disqualify the horse, and result in forfeiture of entry fees for subsequent classes. Management reserves the right to remove a groom, handler/ rider and/ or horse from the show, without being liable for compensation.
6. No judge shall be approached with regards to any decision during the time he/she is judging or is about to judge. Penalty will be disqualification from the show in its entirety.
7. The medical aid fee covers the cost of medical aid on site. The fee does not cover personal expenses incurred by the injured party in the event of an injury or transportation by ambulance.
8. No person other than officials, staff on duty, and the judges of the classes may enter the competition rings without permission of the tournament management. Competitors are allowed in the competition rings only when competing, when the course is open for walking or during scheduled schooling rounds.
9. Dogs must always be on a leash. For safety and sanitary reasons, no dogs will be permitted in the schooling area, show rings or show office.
10. Ponies will have the opportunity to be measured please see steward. Ponies under six years must be measured annually and will be issued a temporary measurement form.

HARD HATS AND ATTIRE

1. All competitors, including foreign competitors, must wear ASTM (American Society for Testing Materials) or BSI approved helmets, with safety harness correctly fastened, always while mounted on the competition grounds.
2. Juniors showing any horse in a jog for soundness must wear approved protective headwear with the attached safety harness fastened.
3. Failure to comply with points 1 and 2 above in the exercise area and/or the competition arena will result in the following penalties:
 - a) 1st violation at competition: warning
 - b) 2nd violation at same competition: disqualification from the competition and forfeiture of all fees and prize monies
4. We would appreciate a formal turnout. Hunter Ring- braiding and hunt jackets always Jumper Ring- (Thursday and Friday)- Collared shirts (i.e. polo shirts) are allowed. (Saturday and Sunday)- Hunt jackets are required.

ARTICLE G103 DRESS

1. All competitors must be properly dressed in the confines of the arena. This includes the inspection of the course and at the presentation of prizes.
2. Competitors should be neatly and suitably dressed in coat, shirt and tie, choker or stock, breeches or jodhpurs and boots. Black or brown smooth leather half chaps are permissible providing they match the boot color.

ARTICLE G1104 HEADGEAR

Conservative colored protective headgear (as per Article G1004) with no additional adornments.

3. If competitors are not suitably dressed, the judge may refuse to allow them to compete.
4. In hunter competitions, in extremely hot weather, coats are optional at the discretion of the Competition Committee.
5. In jumper competitions, in extremely hot weather, riders may, at the discretion of the Competition Committee, be permitted to wear dress or riding shirts with or without chokers and ties or open-neck polo shirts without jackets; no sweatshirts, t-shirts, tank tops or other similar dress will be permitted. Shirts must be neatly tucked into riding breeches.

NON-SHOWING FEE

There will be a non-showing fee of \$100 for horses not entered in any competitions at the tournament. The non-showing fee allows use of the warm-up rings and other grounds as well as access to the rings on warm-up day. All non-showing horses are required to sign an entry waiver and wear a number while on the grounds.

HORS CONCOURS

Hors Concours Pertaining to Jumpers -Article G501

1. Horses shall be allowed to compete "Hors Concours" with permission from the organizing committee but are subject to the same scoring rules as a regular entry with respect to falls, elimination etc. Such entries are not judged and are not eligible for the jump off.
2. A horse or pony that has competed "Hors Concours" is not allowed to compete subsequently in the same ring on the same day.
3. "Hors Concours" entries will follow the last regular entry in the class.
4. "Hors Concours" entries are not allowed in Hunter Divisions, Equitation and Medal classes.

ENTRIES

Entry Procedure: All entries must be completed on www.showgroundslive.com by the closing date listed in the Prize book (May 9th). If you have not used this program before, go to www.showgroundslive.com and register your account, then you will be able to enter online, review your invoice and close out your account at the end of the show. You'll also be able to add/scratch classes for the following days competitions until 4pm. each competition day. A VALID credit card number is required to cover all entry fees, stabling fees and any other applicable fees.



Showgroundslive does so much more than enter you in a show. You can add and drop classes, order hay and shavings, check the Order of Go for a class, sign up in your preferred order the night prior to your class and check results. You can also preview your invoice for the show and close out your account, avoiding the line up at the show office. ShowGroundsLive will give everyone live updates of start times, entries and scheduling

Any updates or schedule changes affecting your ring will be updated through ShowGroundsLive, so we encourage you to confirm your ring status before turning in for the night.

PAYMENT

Full payment of show bill is due upon completion of the tournament. Accounts are to be closed prior to leaving the show grounds. You can review, print invoices and close out the account through ShowGroundsLive or in the Tournament Office. The credit card indicated on the entry form will be responsible for the deposit and all other fees related to the entry. A 3.5% convenience fee will be charged when using credit cards to close accounts. Please confirm with the Office that we have your credit card & CVV. We also accept cash, cheque or e-transfer.

5. Late entries may be accepted up to the date of the show, subject to the approval of the show management and must be accompanied with payment of a \$50.00 late fee.

6. ADD/SCRATCH POLICY: Class adds, drops and class changes are to be submitted either in the tournament office or online through your Showgrounds Live account by 4pm the day prior. Classes added after 4pm the day prior are subject to a \$10 day of add fee per class. In order to be refunded the class fee, it must be scratched prior to the start of the class. Day of add's will go first in the competitions Order of Go, provided the class has a posted order. These policies are necessary to help our Office Team project the most accurate scheduling and orders.

Nominated Rings: Horses entered in the Grass Grand Prix Ring pay a nomination fee of \$125. (With the exception of those entered only in Clear Round Schooling) Horses entered in Low Jumper Ring pay a nomination fee of \$85. Jumper nomination fees are non-refundable. Nomination fees allow jumpers in each of these rings to move from classes and/or divisions without an add/scratch fee.

7. Please list your coach's name on the entry form, if you ride with one, to facilitate the draws for class order. "When registering for EC sanctioned competitions, athletes must indicate the name of their coach on the entry form or specify that they are self-coached. Coaches from other countries must be in good standing with their home federation and must declare/have proof of insurance.

Coaching Requirements at Wild Rose Competitions

Coaches play an essential role in ensuring education and the positive growth and development of competitors. In alignment with upcoming AEF safe sport policies, new requirements are being implemented for coaches participating in Wild Rose Competitions.

To ensure compliance with the guidelines, the following requirements are now in place at all Wild Rose sanctioned competitions:

Entry Forms: All entry forms must include the name of the coach for the entry, or the entry must declare self-coached.

Certification: Starting January 1, 2026, coaching certification requirements will be implemented at provincial circuit competitions. The details are as follows:

Coaching Certification Requirements

NCCP Coaching Certification: All coaches must have NCCP Coaching certification.

Coaches without NCCP Coaching certification may still be eligible to coach if they meet one of the following criteria:

- Hold an active EC Licensed Coach Status
- Hold an active International Group of Equestrian Qualifications (IGEQ) Passport
- Hold a Temporary Coach Badge for the specific competition

Visual Verification

Coaches participating in Wild Rose sanctioned competitions must display either a valid Coach ID Badge or Temporary Coaching Badge. The guidelines for badge visibility are as follows:

Visibility: Badges must be worn in a visible manner by coaches while on competition grounds, with the following exceptions:

- While riding a horse in the warm-up ring for a class where they are the competitor.
- While competing in a class in the competition ring.

Badge Assignment: Badges are individually assigned to each coach and must not be shared.

How to Apply for a Coach ID Badge

Coaches who have NCCP coaching certification, an active EC Licensed Coach Status, or an active IGEQ Passport can apply to receive their Coach ID Badge by completing the form on AEF website (photo identification must accompany application).

How to Purchase a Temporary Coaching Badge

Coaches who do not have the required certifications can purchase a Temporary Coaching Badge. Temporary Coaching Badges are \$50 and valid only for the competition they were purchased for. Purchased badges will be available for pick up at the competition show office.

By implementing these requirements, we can ensure the safety, well-being, and integrity of AEF members in sport.

ARTICLE

Role of the Person Responsible at EC sanctioned competitions:

The Person Responsible (PR) is responsible and accountable under the violation and penalty provisions of EC Rules for the care, training, custody and performance of the horse and must be present at the competition as well as sign and provide a license/member number on the competition entry form.

***Please note: The Person Responsible (PR) must sign the competition entry form. The PR must be an EC Sport Licence Holder in good standing OR in the case of junior/minor owner entries, a parent/guardian is entitled to sign as PR.**

(Parents/guardians are not required to have an EC Sport License or EC Registered Participant status provided they agree to abide by the rules and penalties contained in the Rule Book and acknowledge that they are liable under the penalty provisions of the Rules for any violations of the EC Rules by their minor child).

REFUNDS

1. Exhibitors cancelling their entries after the official closing date, but prior to the start of the show shall, upon presentation of a valid veterinary certificate, forfeit their stall, tack room and office fees, but will be refunded levy fees and 50% of all other fees. Substitutions will be permitted, prior to the start of the show, for a fee of \$25.00.

2. Barn Bills & Trainers Splits: Trainers requiring barn bills should set them up at the beginning of the tournament with an open cheque or a credit card number. Trainer's splits must be done no later than Saturday of the competition.



Entries for the Edmonton Classic EC Gold (for JC Medal, CET Medal and Mini-Medal)

1. Equestrian Canada Horse Recording/ Passports are mandatory for all horses and ponies entered in the Edmonton Classic Horse Show EC Gold show. (CET, CET mini & JC Medal)
2. All riders and owners must have an individual gold sport license in Equestrian Canada or be bona fide members of their own National Equestrian Federations. Rider and owner membership numbers must be submitted with entries. . (A one time upgrade License Upgrade – Single Event maybe purchased Single Event Upgrades are available for purchase **directly through the competitors MyEC portal**. There is a flat rate of \$55 per upgrade, regardless of levels being upgraded. Riders and Owners (for insurance purposes) must be a member in good standing with Equestrian Canada. Numbers will not be issued to anyone who is not in good standing.
3. Competitors will be assessed a fee of \$25 for the Jump Canada Levy, \$8 for drug fees, and \$10 for the Jump Alberta Levy.
4. Any horse entered in any class at a competition, while on the competition grounds be selected for equine medication control testing at the event location. (A602.5)

STABLING

1. Stabling is available at Amberlea Meadows for all competitors at a rate of **\$340 with 5 bags of shavings + GST** for the duration of the show. (A603D). Hauling in for the day is allowed, and a day stall may be purchased for **\$135 with 5 bags of shavings/day**. Haul-ins are also allowed for a **Haul in fee of \$60 per day or \$150 /week**. Tack stalls are available. Feed and bedding is available for sale from the show office. Competitors are required to order bedding on entry form. Initial shavings orders will be delivered, and subsequent orders will be ordered from office. (Stabling will include 5 bags of shavings per stall) **\$30 Environmental fee per entry** Effective in 2026, all stabling will have an environmental fee attached. This fee is to cover the cost of the disposal of the manure.
2. Trainers wishing to split the cost of tack stalls must open a trainer split account. Permanent Stabling available.
3. No horse will be placed in an unassigned stall without approval from management.
4. Stabling will be available from 12:00 pm May 20 and is available until May 24, 2026

TROPHIES, RIBBONS AND PRIZE MONEY

1. Ribbons will be given to sixth place in all classes except Medal Classes or unless otherwise specified.
2. Prize money will be divided as follows unless otherwise specified:
 - a. First=28%, Second=24%, Third=19%, Fourth=14%, Fifth=10%, Sixth=5%
 - b. Jumper Classics and Hunter Classic will divide prize money as follows:
First=25%, Second=20%, Third=15%, Fourth=12%, Fifth=10%, Sixth=8%,
Seventh=5%, Eighth=5%
3. Points for championships shall be awarded on the following basis: 1st (7 points), 2nd (5 points), 3rd (4 points), 4th (3 points), 5th (2 points), 6th (1 point).
4. Jumper Championship In the case of a tie for the Champion/Reserve, the highest placing in the largest prize money class of the division will be used. If all classes have same prize money, the last class of the division will be used. If there is still a tie for the Reserve, the highest placing in the second largest prize money class of the division will be used, or if all classes have the same prize money, the second last class of the division will be used.
5. Hunter Championship: The Champion and Reserve Champion titles shall be awarded to the two that have accumulated the most points competing in the division in which they are being shown. In the case of a tie, the Championship and/or Reserve shall be awarded to the horse that has accumulated the most points over fences. In the event there is still a tie, the tied horses shall be shown at walk, trot, and canter to determine championship and reserve. Tossing a coin to break the tie is permissible if all participants agree. This competition shall be judged as an independent Hunter Under Saddle class with information, quality, substance, soundness and performance to count as prescribed throughout the appropriate division.
6. **To qualify for Division Championships, competitors must enter and have completed all the classes in the Division to be eligible for awards.**

PONY HUNTERS

Respective Heights Ponies that are ridden by an adult in the competition may not be ridden by a junior at the same competition. Small ponies are not to exceed 12.2 hands, medium ponies are over 12.2 hands but do not exceed 13.2 hands and large ponies are over 13.2 hands but do not exceed 14.2 hands. Ponies entered in the Small, Medium or Large Pony Hunter divisions are required to have a valid measurement card or be measured by the show steward. Sign up times for measurements are reserved through the Competition Office. Pony divisions with less than 6 entries will be combined.

This is a 1 year pilot program for 2026. G306.2

- a) Adults are permitted to show (be judged) on ponies in miscellaneous non rated EC sanctioned classes not limited to juniors
- b) Adult Amateurs may ride large ponies in Adult Amateur classes where fences do not exceed 3' (0.90m). See G309, G310
- c) A pony shown in any judged class(es), either hunter or jumper, by an adult may not be shown in judged classes by a junior on the same day.
- d) An adult competing on a pony in miscellaneous non-rated EC sanctioned classes must not compete higher than the pony's appropriate obstacle height as per G302.
- e) Suitability of the pony to the rider and manners of the pony must be emphasized in all classes. Judges must penalize but not necessarily eliminate an entry not having such suitability and manners. Pony Hunter classes are open to ponies ridden by junior rider's subject to the following restrictions: Junior A riders may ride large ponies only. Junior B & C riders may ride ponies of all heights. Adults are permitted to show (be judged) large ponies in miscellaneous non-point classes not limited to juniors and adult amateurs may ride large ponies in adult amateur classes where fences do not exceed 3' (0.90).

EHJA Private Photographer Policy:

- Media passes are mandatory for all private photographers and are \$300 CAD per photographer per horse show.
- The private photographer fee is to be paid in advance. Photographers are required to provide a client list and proof of Accident Liability Insurance prior to the start of the horse show.

Private Photographer Rules

- Official Photographer **S.Capturing The Moment Photography** and all of their representatives will have priority in positioning around the arenas.
- Accredited photographers are allowed inside the ring for awards ceremonies upon request.
- Private photographers may not shoot in the ring nor place remote camera equipment in the ring or alongside the ring with prior approval.

Media Photographers/Videographers

Photographers representing newspapers, magazines, websites, and other media, with the purpose of appearing in print and online placements are exempt from the vendor fee but must notify the show office of their intentions prior to shooting. Photos taken may only be used for media purposes and cannot be sold to third parties.

SCHOOLING ROUNDS ARTICLE G1104 SCHOOLING

All EC-sanctioned competitions must use current FEI schooling rules as listed. (Annex 1) These rules pertain to all hunter, equitation and jumper classes and divisions at all EC sanctioned competitions. Hunter ring schooling rounds will be available (weather permitting) from 8:00 am until 4:00 pm on Thursday, May 21. (Times may change slightly, subject to demand.) Schooling round times may be booked in blocks for stables. All competitors wishing to school must purchase a schooling pass. The horse must have its competitions number on. Pass price \$45.00 /horse for hunter ring #2 and \$30.00/round for hunter ring #1. Please call (780) 780-955-7608.

EHJA ,Amberlea Stables Ltd., nor the owners, management, tournament committee, nor any of its staff or agents shall in any way be liable for any accident, injury, damage, loss or for any other matter that may happen to exhibitors, competitors, owners, or members of their families, or their agents or to anyone on the grounds, or for any other loss, claim, matter, circumstances or event whatever, in connection with or arising out of, or attributable to, the tournament or any journey to or from the tournament. It is understood that under no circumstances shall EHJA, Amberlea Stables Ltd., nor the owners, management, tournament committee, nor any of its staff or agents be liable for any loss, damages, claims or costs as a result of Amberlea Stables Ltd., nor the owners, management, tournament committee, nor any of its staff or agents, negligence, and that you agree to indemnify and save harmless EHJA, Amberlea Stables Ltd., nor the owners, management, tournament committee, nor any of its staff or agents from and against any and all liability arising out of such loss, damages, claims or costs.

RV PARKING

Campers or motor homes are to be parked in the southwest parking lot by the arena, where plug-ins are available for \$200/ week + GST Dry camping \$100 /Week+GST.. No RV's with propane tanks will be allowed to park within 50 feet of any building to avoid potential fire risk. Showers are available for public use in the main barn area. A septic tank dumping station is also available for use. Please contact office 780-955-7608 to reserve your RV spot.

LOST AND FOUND

Lost and found is located at the office. Items not claimed within two weeks of the end of the competition will be donated.

MOTORIZED VEHICLES

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the province in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above-described motorized vehicles if they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent(s), legal guardians(s), or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offence. Wheelchair and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

CONCUSSION Accidents & Return to Play rule: In the event of a fall/accident where a concussion can be reasonably suspected, the competitors must receive medical clearance by qualified medical personnel onsite before continuing to compete. The competitor is solely responsible for ensuring the onsite medical assessment takes place. Should a competitor refuse to be evaluated, they will be disqualified from the competition. If onsite qualified medical personnel suspect a concussion or believe the competitor may be at risk of concussion due to the nature of the fall or impact, the competitor will be suspended from competition and placed on a Medical Suspension List until medically released. Competitors will remain on the EC Medical Suspension List until they submit an EC Return to Play m, signed by a licensed physician, to EC. No competitor shall compete at EC sanctioned competitions while on the EC Medical Suspension List and competition organizers may refuse entry to anyone currently on the list.

BIOSECURITY

Bio Security is everyone's responsibility! Amberlea Meadows and EHJA is committed to providing a safe and healthy environment for all exhibitors and their horses. All show participants are requested to practice good disease prevention practices. Travelling and showing horses are at an increased risk for spreading and contracting contagious diseases. All horses entering the show grounds must not have been in contact with any sick horses within the last 14 days. They must not exhibit any sign of illness. All horses coming on to the grounds must provide proof of valid Equine Influenza and EHV vaccinations (vaccinations must be administered within the last 6 months, but not within 7 days of arrival to the grounds). Horses exhibiting any signs of illness are not permitted on the grounds. All horses on the grounds must have their temperatures taken and recorded twice daily. Please have temperature records available upon request. Competitors are required to notify the tournament office at the first sign of illness or elevated temperature. Horses missing valid vaccinations will NOT be permitted on the grounds and entries are NOT eligible for a refund of fees. NO EXCEPTIONS. Proof of vaccination must be signed by a vet, on vet letterhead. The name on the vaccination MUST MATCH the name on the entry to be acceptable. Please take the horses temperature 3 days prior to bringing them to the show grounds (this includes horses hauling in). Horses are not permitted to come on to the grounds if they are stabled at a facility where any horses have been at a venue with a confirmed case of EHV (neurologic or non-neurologic) or any other transmissible disease/ illness within the last 10 days. In the case of a horse that is unable to receive either of the vaccinations due to a history of adverse reactions, the exhibitor must provide a letter from the veterinarian on official letterhead stating that the horse in question cannot be vaccinated due to medical concerns and a log of temperatures taken twice daily for the seven days prior to entering the competition grounds then continue to follow temperature checks twice daily while on the grounds. Please avoid direct and/or indirect contact between horses, especially nose-to-nose contact

EQUINE VACCINATION RULE

"All horses attending Equestrian Canada sanctioned competitions must have met the requirements of Article A519, Vaccinations. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article A519.



EQUESTRIAN CANADA VACCINATION RULE

All horses attending Equestrian Canada sanctioned competitions must have been administered Equine Influenza and Equine Herpes Virus (1&4) vaccinations within 6 months (+21 days grace period) before arrival at the event. No horse shall receive vaccination within 7 days prior to arrival at the event. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be asked to leave the event site at the discretion of Competition Management.
