STATEMENT OF PRINCIPLE

Equestrian Canada (EC), the national equestrian federation of Canada, supports adherence to humane treatment of horses in all activities under its jurisdiction.

- . EC is committed to:
- . Upholding the welfare of the horses, regardless of value, as a primary consideration in all activities;
- . Requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect and the compassion that they deserve, and that they never be subjected to mistreatment;
- . Ensuring that owners, trainers and exhibitors or their agents use responsible care in the handling, treatment and transportation of their horses as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose;
- . Providing for the continuous well-being of horses by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort and safety as a matter of standard operating procedure;
- . Continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare;
- . Increasing education in training and horsemanship practices;
- . Requiring owners, trainers and exhibitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules, and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competition;
- . Reviewing, revising and developing competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of the horses.

The standard by which conduct or treatment will be measured is that which a person, informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and exhibition procedures, would determine to be neither cruel, abusive, nor inhumane.

Per Article A801 every entry at an EC-sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person responsible that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider and horse shall be subject to the EC constitution and all rules of EC and any additional rules set by the competition. It is the responsibility of all individuals participating in any capacity in EC- sanctioned competitions to be knowledgeable regarding the EC constitution and the applicable rules of EC and the additional rules, if any, imposed by the competition. Do not participate in this EC- sanctioned competition in any capacity if you do not consent to be bound by the constitution and rules of EC and any additional rules imposed by the competition.

Gold Competition Riders:

Owners and lessees are required to hold a sport license equivalent to the level at which the rider and horse are competing. The owner must hold a license equivalent to the level at which his/her horse is competing, regardless of whether he/she is riding the horse in competition. A one time upgrade License Upgrade is available for purchase **directly through the competitors MyEC portal**. There is a flat rate of \$55 per upgrade, regardless of levels being upgraded.

• Temporary Sport Licences and Horse Recordings are no longer available for purchase.

. Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules of EC and will be held and judged in accordance with the EC Rule Book. Direct all questions regarding rules and regulations to the steward.

Wild Rose Competition Riders only:

Do not require EC Sport Licenses for the rider nor EC Horse Recordings. The rider does require AEF (or other Provincial) membership.

- **All horses attending Equestrian Canada / sanctioned competitions must have met the requirements of Article A519, Vaccinations. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article A519, Vaccinations."**

"Per Article A801, every entry at an EC-sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person responsible that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider and horse shall be subject to the EC constitution and all rules of EC and any additional rules set by the competition..." (A602.7)

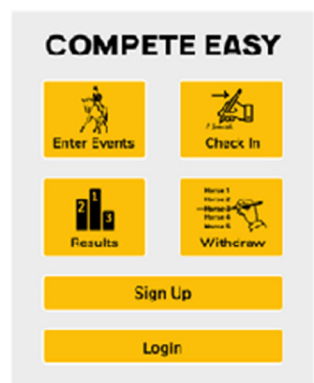

ENTRY INFORMATION AND RULES

1. Entries must be received by June 25, 2025 with full payment for the July 5-6, 2025 Dressage Festival

- **ENTRIES ONLINE AT <https://www.competeeasy.com/>**

- **All entries must be submitted through Compete Easy. No paper entries will be accepted.**

2. Horses competing in an EC Gold show are required to hold an EC Horse Recording and have paid the EC Horse Recording Annual Activation Fee to compete. Horse Recording number is the control number used by EC and must be included on the entry. Horses must be entered under the name appearing on the Horse recording. Owners and competitors holding a Horse Recording who wish to apply for an FEI passport refer to Article A412. (Note: Horses that formerly held EC Passports will carry the same number forward to their Horse Recording.) Temporary sport licenses and temp. horse registration available at the show office

3. Gold Classes Riders, owners and lessees are required to hold a sport license equivalent to the level at which the rider and horse are competing. The owner must hold a license equivalent to the level at which his/her horse is competing, regardless of whether he/she is riding the horse in competition

4. Entries in the Wild Rose Show only do not require EC Sport Licenses for the rider nor EC Horse Recordings. The rider does require AEF (or other Provincial) membership. Tests ridden in the Wild Rose classes are not eligible for Equestrian Canada awards.

5. EQUINE VACCINATION RULE

"All horses attending Equestrian Canada sanctioned competitions must have met the requirements of Article A519, Vaccinations. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article A519.

All horses coming on to the grounds must provide proof of valid Equine Influenza and EHV vaccinations (vaccinations must be administered within the last 6 months, but not within 7 days of arrival to the grounds). Horses not in compliance with this rule may be asked to leave event site at the discretion of competition management.

6. Entries in the Gold show must pay a mandatory DC Levy Fee of \$12.00 and an Equestrian Canada drug fee of \$8.00. "Any horse entered in any class at a competition may be selected for equine medication control while at the event location." (A602.5) Medication Control Fee: \$8.00.

7. All entries must have the signature of the owner or agent and a signature for the person responsible for the horse. Riders will not be allowed to ride without a person responsible signature. The owner, person responsible and rider of the horse competing must be EC Individual competitor members in good standing. See A1011 for clarification of person responsible. The Person Responsible (PR) for a horse must be an adult who has, or shares responsibility for the care, training, custody, and performance of the horse and who has official responsibility for that horse under EC Rules. The PR is liable under the penalty provisions of the applicable EC Rules for any rule violations. Every entry form for an EC sanctioned competition must identify the PR and be signed by the PR. The Person Responsible is ultimately responsible for the condition, fitness and management of the horse and is alone responsible for any act performed by himself/herself or by any other person with authorized access to the horse in the stables, elsewhere on the grounds, or while the horse is being ridden, driven or exercised.

8 It is compulsory for the horse's competition number to be worn by the horse/ rider/ handler in exercise and schooling areas from the time the number is issued to the end of the competition to identify the horse. Failure to comply will result in a warning for the first offense and possible elimination for subsequent offenses.

9. "When registering for EC sanctioned competitions, athletes must indicate the name of their coach on the entry form or specify that they are self-coached. Coaches from other countries, must be in good standing with their home federation and must declare/have proof of insurance" See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article 102, Safe Sport Environments.

10. Schooling horses not competing at cost of \$52.50 per day (schooling horse fee). Rider/Owner must complete entry form and will be assigned a Horse Number which must always be worn when on grounds. Riders will be required to pay the full stabling fee, schooling horse fee, and the office fee and will be subject to all Equine Competition rules. The rider will be required to have an AEF membership, but will not be required to have an EC membership and the horse will not require EC Horse Recording.

11. Any riding time changes must be approved by the show secretary prior to the competition.

12. No person other than the officials, stewards, attendants, on duty and the judges of the class may enter the show ring

without permission from the officials. Competitors entering the arena outside of the posted warm up times will be eliminated.

13. Lungeing will only be permitted in a designated lungeing area. Please ask once you arrive at the show grounds for more information. E7.16.5. The use of side reins is only permitted when lunging. Lungeing (un-mounted) and work in hand may only be done by the rider, owner, coach, groom or Person Responsible. Please do not ride in designated area when a horse is being lunged.

14. Inhumane treatment of a horse including polling, rapping or other abuse will not be tolerated, and any exhibitor will be disqualified for such an offence.

15. The Show Committee reserves the right to remove any horse/ rider from the competition without being liable for compensation.

16. Protests shall be made in writing within 48 hours of the holding of the class to the horse show office and must be accompanied by a deposit of \$100 in cash which will be forfeited if the protest is not sustained. All protests must be in writing, signed and addressed to the secretary of the competition at which the matter under consideration occurs.

17. There will be no test readers provided by the show, all riders must supply their own readers.

18. Standard whip length is 120 cm including the lash and ponies ridden in ANY class can only carry a whip of 100 cm Including Lash E4.8.3 & .4

19. Safety Headgear: All riders, regardless of age or level of competition, must always wear ASTM/SEI or BSI/BS EN approved protective headgear when mounted at any EC sanctioned dressage competitions at the event location.

Note: At the tack check, which that follows the test, the steward may ask the athlete to dismount so that the helmet can be inspected for the safety standard labelling. (E 4.0)

20. Ride Times will be posted on the Compete Easy website at <https://www.competeeasy.com/Equest/PinneyNumber.aspx> as soon as available to all competitors on Tuesday July 1st Every effort will be made to accommodate riders to allow for suitable warm up when possible. FINAL RIDE TIMES POSTED ONLINE AT THIS LINK. Riders are responsible for checking their ride times daily as ride times may change. Please provide a correct email on your entry for

21. The show organizers reserve the right to refuse any entry. (Other than as specified in Article A805.2, a competition may reserve the right to refuse an entry). Entries will be entered on a first come first serve basis. Entry early to assure your place. Classes may be changed up to closing date without penalty.

22. Hors Concours entries will be accepted with full fees. Entrants are subject to EC rules, and are not eligible for awards.

23. Riders may scratch their entry through Compete Easy. Before the entries closing date, the scratch fee is \$50. After the closing date and before June 27 at 6 pm, the scratch fee is \$150. After June 28 at 1pm, and prior to July 4 at 6 pm, the scratch fee is \$250. Compete Easy will refund all fees in excess of the scratch fee to your credit card. All stabling, shavings, classes, ride times etc, will revert to Dressage Festival, who will reassign if possible

24. Horse substitutions are allowed until one hour before class the horse is competing in for \$52.50. The name of the horse, any required licenses and owner or personal responsible signatures must be given to the show secretary at the time of substitution is made.

25. Competitors are responsible for checking the day sheets posted at the show office, the evening before, and/or the morning of their tests to ensure they are aware of the correct time. Remember, your time is when you ride down centerline, The Organizing committee will keep changes to a minimum.

26. Please note that Coggins Tests will not be required for this show. As per Article A519 **All horses are required to be verifiably current on Influenza and EHV 1-4 vaccines (within 6 months)** You must provide proof of vaccination for all of your horses on the grounds, showing or non competing. Please avoid any direct or indirect contact between horses, in particular nose to nose contact and use of any common feed/ drinking buckets

27. Para-Dressage Information

In order to compete at an EC Gold competition, Para-Dressage athletes must have an EC Classification Profile.

Para-Dressage competitions are governed by Section E of EC Rules. EC Para-Dressage National Tests and/or the FEI Para-Dressage tests, including the FEI Introductory Test A (Grade I-V), and the FEI Introductory Test B (Grade I-V) may be used. EC Para-Dressage tests can be found at www.equestrian.ca/sport/para-dressage/tests. Please refer to the FEI Website for FEI Para-Dressage Tests.

- All EC Para-Dressage Tests are held in a 20M X 40M arena.
- FEI Tests for Grades I-III are held in a 20M X 40M arena
- FEI tests for Grades IV-V compete, wherever possible, in a 20M X 60M arena.
- EC Sports License equal to level of competition
- Athletes of all grades, as well as horses, may compete in a maximum of 4 tests per day
- Competitors with a physical or visual impairment who uses compensating aid(s) and are competing at the EC Silver or Gold Level must have a Para-Dressage Classification Profile.
- Para-Dressage Athletes are required to submit a copy of the Para-Dressage Dispensation Certificate and/or EC Classification Profile with their entries for each show. They must be listed on the Para-Dressage Classification Master List and Para-Dressage Dispensation Master List.

28. Masters Test of Choice

The Masters Test of Choice is an Equestrian Canada (EC) dressage class that provides senior riders, 60 years and older, the opportunity to participate in a dressage class that is exclusively their own in an environment that provides a fair playing field for

senior riders wherein each will compete against their peers at all levels of skill, from beginners to advanced.

DETAILS:

1. Masters classes are open to riders 60 years of age and above.
2. Any EC sanctioned dressage competition may offer the Masters Test of Choice.
3. The class will be offered as a Miscellaneous Test of Choice class as per the EC Rules, Section A: General Regulations, A503 and will include all levels, national to FEI.
4. In the event of a large number of entries, the class may be divided into two – lower and upper dressage levels – with separate sets of ribbons.
5. The class will be included in the competition prize list with the appropriate entry fee.
6. The class will feature one test per day and may have a class championship.
7. Scores from Masters classes will not count towards EC championships or awards programs.
8. Masters riders may also compete in non-Masters dressage classes.
9. To facilitate ease of riding, the following accommodations are available in the Masters Test of Choice:
 - a) Rising trot is optional in all trot work.
 - b) Callers/riders may use headsets (someone, e.g., a competition appointed supervisor (E.4.9.A.8. Exception) only, may stand beside the caller to ensure no coaching takes place).
 - c) Entry bell/whistle can have a secondary indicator (e.g., the caller can raise an arm once the bell rings).
 - d) Use of voice
 - e) Equipment accommodations may include any or all of the following: Looped reins; Converters on double bridle to create single rein; Gel or fluffy seat covers; and/or Two whips.
10. Judges for the Masters Test of Choice must be EC certified Dressage Judges at the Basic, Medium or Senior level.

29. Tests for show are available for download at: www.equinecanada.ca/dressage.

30. Please provide a correct email on your entry form. (Competitors are responsible for their own errors or those of their agents in preparation of their entry forms)

31. The EC, Amberlea Meadows, Show Officials and Show volunteers shall not be responsible for any damages, losses, accidents, or any actions whatsoever that may occur to any entrant, owner, exhibitor, or spectator during the show. Parties execute a binding agreement upon signing of entry form.

32. **The warm-up rings are open during** all the show and schooling time.

CLASS DESCRIPTIONS & RULES

Wild Rose Flat (Rail) Classes

English Pleasure – To be shown at walk, trot and canter, not to gallop. Judged 50% on performance, 40% on manners and 10% on conformation.

Equitation – To be shown at walk, trot and canter, not to gallop. Judged 40% on rider's position and seat. 40% on rider's correct effective use of the aids and 20% on harmony between horse and rider. Rider may show in English or Western tack.

STABLE RULES

The stabling is not available until noon, Friday, July 4, 2025. Please do not plan your arrival before this time. Warm up in all rings will be available from 12:00 p.m. – 8:00 p.m. Friday and for one hour after the completion of the last class on Saturday. This time will be posted and confirmed when scheduling is completed. Riding in the competition arena outside of these times will result in the elimination of the horse and rider from competition.

1. **Show stalls** are available from **12:00 noon, Friday, July 04, 2025** until the end of the Show on **Sunday July 6, 2025**. at a cost of \$131.25. *****First bedding of 2 bags of shavings is provided please indicate on your entry form.***** Tack Stalls \$115.50 Hauling in for the day is allowed, and a day stall may be purchased for \$84.00 /day (includes 2 shavings). Haul-ins are also allowed for a Haul in fee of \$42.00 per day. Tack stalls are available. Feed and bedding is available for sale from the show office
2. All dogs must be kept on a leash. Please clean up after your dog.
3. NO SMOKING IN THE BARN OR HAYSHED!!
4. Horses must be put in assigned stalls only! No bedding may be removed out of unoccupied stalls. No horse will be placed in an unassigned stall without approval from management. Stalls will be assigned at the sole discretion of the Show Manager. Special requests should be noted on the entry form and will be accommodated at the discretion of show management.
5. The stable area must always be kept clean and aisles unobstructed
6. **Shavings – PRE-ORDER WITH YOUR STALL** – will be arranged by the horse show from quality suppliers on a pre-order basis so **place your orders for shavings with stall orders**. Your order will be delivered to your stall(s). 2 Shavings are included additional shavings must be purchased in advance for \$12.00/bag.
7. Please deposit all manure and hay in manure bins.
8. **Absolutely NO use of Nails in Tack Stalls.**

Note: If you would like to be stabled next to someone, please ensure that the same Stable Group Name or trainer is used, as this is how the stalls are assigned.

SCHOOLING TIME - The show rings will be open for practice prior to the show. Times will be posted at the show office if entries warrant. All show rings will be open for warm-up up until Friday evening from 1pm-8 pm. No warm-up in the show rings is allowed from Saturday a.m. until the conclusion of the show.

RV PARKING

1. Campers or motorhomes are to be parked in the southwest parking lot by the arena, where plug-ins are available for \$52.50/ night or \$105.00 weekend. No RV's with propane tanks will be allowed to park within 50 feet of any building to avoid potential fire risk. Showers are available for public use in the main barn area. A septic tank dumping station is also available for use.

BIOSECURITY

Bio Security is everyone's responsibility! Amberlea Meadows and EHJA is committed to providing a safe and healthy environment for all exhibitors and their horses. All show participants are requested to practice good disease prevention practices. Travelling and showing horses are at an increased risk for spreading and contracting contagious diseases. All horses entering the show grounds must not have been in contact with any sick horses within the last 14 days. They must not exhibit any sign of illness. All horses coming on to the grounds must provide proof of valid Equine Influenza and EHV vaccinations (vaccinations must be administered within the last 6 months, but not within 7 days of arrival to the grounds). Horses exhibiting any signs of illness are not permitted on the grounds. All horses on the grounds must have their temperatures taken and recorded twice daily. Please have temperature records available upon request. Competitors are required to notify the tournament office at the first sign of illness or elevated temperature. Horses missing valid vaccinations will NOT be permitted on the grounds and entries are NOT eligible for a refund of fees. NO EXCEPTIONS. Proof of vaccination must be signed by a vet, on vet letterhead. The name on the vaccination MUST MATCH the name on the entry to be acceptable. In the case of a horse that is unable to receive either of the vaccinations due to a history of adverse reactions, the exhibitor must provide a letter from the veterinarian on official letterhead stating that the horse in question cannot be vaccinated due to medical concerns and a log of temperatures taken twice daily for the seven days prior to entering the competition grounds then continue to follow temperature checks twice daily while on the grounds. Please avoid direct and/or indirect contact between horses, especially nose-to-nose contact.

CLASSES

1. A horse/rider combination may compete in any two, but only two consecutive levels and a maximum of four tests per day including the freestyle for Introductory, Training and First levels, and three tests per day including the freestyle for Second; Third and Fourth levels and all FEI tests. All Tests will be ridden in a 20 x 60 ring for the duration of the show. (A 7.11.9.1)
2. Ride times will only be changed in the case of error, overlapping times, or to facilitate the running of the show. Riders of multiple horses should enter as early as possible to avoid schedule conflicts. Final times to be emailed, posted on the shows website and on Compete easy. Times are only an approximation.
3. Test of Choice Classes may only be entered once per class. Tests ridden in TOC classes may be used as qualifiers for Gold Provincial/Regional/National championships as well as for Silver Championships and team qualifications, if permitted in the team qualification criteria. Tests Ridden in TOC Classes may be used to qualify for Gold, Silver or Bronze Show Championships. (E7.31)
4. Exhibitors must be ready to compete when scheduled.
5. Class results will be posted online at Compete easy dressage and posted on the show grounds throughout the show.
6. Any horse receiving less than 50% of the total points obtainable shall not be eligible for awards
7. When there is only one horse in a class placing will be determined as per the following chart of percentages:
 - 1st63% or higher
 - 2nd60% to 62.9%
 - 3rd.....58% to 59.9%

No ribbons or rs shall be awarded below 3rd position

8. In the event of a tie, ties will be broken by the collective marks. Ties remaining after collective marks will stay tied.
9. Prize will be awarded to Freestyle
10. Combining Classes – if there are fewer than three entries in a category, the committee may combine entries into the Open Category.
11. Freestyle Music must be provided to the show organizer, Your Freestyle music MUST BE EMAILED TO Kathy Ingram kating@telus.net • Competitors are responsible to do a sound check with the announcer
 - Freestyle eligibility for athletes in Gold and Silver competitions (all EC levels and FEI freestyle levels): A horse/rider combination must have obtained the following prior to competing in a freestyle: a minimum score of 60% in a dressage test at the same technical level, or higher, as the freestyle they wish to enter (e.g. 60% in First or Second Level to compete in the First and/or Second Level Freestyle). The dressage score may have been obtained at an EC Gold/Silver dressage competition prior to the competition or may be obtained at the same competition in which they wish to enter the freestyle. Note: Bronze competitions require no minimum technical score. Furthermore, an athlete in a Bronze competition may enter a freestyle without having ridden the technical test at the level of freestyle entered (e.g. competes in first level technical and second level freestyle)

Amberlea Private Photographer Policy:

- Media passes are mandatory for all private photographers and are \$300 CAD per photographer per horse show.
- The private photographer fee is to be paid in advance. Photographers are required to provide a client list and proof of Accident Liability Insurance prior to the start of the horse show.

Private Photographer Rules

- Official Photographer **S.Capturing The Moment Photography** and all of their representatives will have priority in positioning around the arenas.
- Accredited photographers are allowed inside the ring for awards ceremonies upon request.
- Private photographers may not shoot in the ring nor place remote camera equipment in the ring or alongside the ring with prior approval.

Media Photographers/Videographers

Photographers representing newspapers, magazines, websites, and other media, with the purpose of appearing in print and online placements are exempt from the vendor fee but must notify the show office of their intentions prior to shooting. Photos taken may only be used for media purposes and cannot be sold to third parties.

CHAMPIONSHIP AND RESERVE CHAMPIONSHIP

The average of all championship tests ridden will be used to determine the Show Champions and Reserve Champions. At least two(2) tests must be ridden to be eligible for show championships. The highest average will be used to determine the Show Champion, and the second highest average will be used to determine the Show Reserve Champion. Only classes specified as Championship classes (©) will count towards championships.

These are planned show championships. The organizing committee reserves the right to combine or split championships depending on entries.

Alberta Equestrian Federation Wild Rose Show Information

The Amberlea Meadows Dressage Festival is sanctioned as an Alberta Wild Rose Provincial Circuit Competition and will be run in accordance with the AEF Wild Rose Competition Rulebook.

Every participant at the AEF Wild Rose Competition shall agree that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider, and horse shall be subject to the constitution and the rules of the competition.

Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current Wild Rose Competition Rulebook and will be judged in accordance with the Rulebook.

Any horse entered in any class at a competition may be selected for equine medication control testing while at the event location.

When registering for Wild Rose sanctioned competitions, athletes must indicate the name of their coach on the entry form or indicate they are self-coached.

All horses participating in the Wild Rose provincial circuit competition must have received Equine Influenza and Equine Herpes Virus (1&4) vaccinations within the last 6 months, with a 21 day grace period before the event.

Entries in the Wild Rose show only require an AEF (or other Provincial) membership for the rider. All classes in the Wild Rose show are not rated for EC awards.

Air Quality Guidelines

Amberlea Meadows follows Equestrian Canada's (EC) guidelines for air quality to ensure the safety and well being of both horses and athletes. WE use the Air Quality Index (AQHI) provided by Environment and Climate Change Canada to assess conditions during the event.

Competition Adjustments Due to Air Quality

- If the AQHI reaches 7 or higher (High Risk), competition and training schedules may be modified or postponed at the discretion of the Organizing Committee. Adjustments will be communicated to all participants.
- If the AQHI reaches 10 or higher (Very High Risk), all competition and training will be cancelled or rescheduled.

Responsibility of Participants

- Riders, coaches and officials are encouraged to monitor AQHI reports leading up to and during the event.
- Those with respiratory sensitivities or concerns should take extra precautions and consult with a medical professional if needed.
- Stabling areas will be monitored to ensure horses are not experiencing distress due to air quality conditions.

EC SPORT LICENSING 2025

SAFETY, INCLUSIVITY, & EXCELLENCE

Your guide to the latest updates for the competition season in Canada

IMPORTANT CHANGES have been implemented to enhance the safety and inclusivity of equestrian sport. Whether you're an athlete, parent, coach, official, or competition staff, your role is crucial in upholding these standards. Here's what you need to know:

SAFE SPORT TRAINING PREREQUISITE:

- The two free EC Safe Sport training modules must be completed before purchasing a Sport Licence. Check your training status on MyEC by clicking on the ECampus button.

DISCONTINUED TEMPORARY LICENCES AND TEMPORARY HORSE REGISTRATIONS:

- Temporary EC Sport Licences are now discontinued at competitions. All riders, owners, and coaches must possess an EC Sport Licence to participate in events. All horses must have a Horse Recording where level and division require.

AVAILABLE SHOW LEVEL UPGRADES:

- Explore higher-level competitions with temporary upgrades via your MyEC Portal. Note: National Rankings Points are not tabulated for upgraded results.

COACH STATUS REQUIREMENTS:

- All coaches at EC-sanctioned events require EC Licensed Coach Status. For upgrading from Registered to Licensed Status, coaches can apply for a Temporary Coach Status (TCS) to fulfill the requirement for each event.
- New for 2025: A TCS may be purchased conveniently online via the MyEC Portal only. Each TCS is valid for a single event.

EMPOWERING SELF-COACHED ATHLETES:

- Athletes without a coach on-site can declare themselves as self-coached by providing their name and EC Sport Licence number on their entry form. Coaches that are not present at the event with the athlete are not to be listed on the entry form.

“ When registering for EC sanctioned competitions, athletes must indicate the name of their coach on the entry form or specify that they are self-coached. Coaches from other countries, must be in good-standing with their home federation and must declare/have proof of insurance. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article 102, Safe Sport Environments. ”
